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The Capital Irish Film Festival begins Thursday!

The biggest Irish film festival in the U.S. runs from December 1-10 in Washington DC.



THE FILMS

This year's festival will include the features **PARKED** (directed by Darragh Byrne and featuring Colm Meaney), **AS IF I AM NOT THERE** (Ireland's official entry for the 2012 Oscars, directed by Juanita Wilson), **SENSATION** (directed by Tom Hall and featuring Domhnall Gleeson) and **REWIND**, as well as **ALL GOOD CHILDREN** (official selection Cannes Film Festival 2010), **THE OTHER SIDE OF SLEEP** (official selection Cannes Film Festival 2011) and the U.S. premiere of **MEETING ON THE STAIRS**.

Opening the festival this year is **THE LOTUS EATERS** by first time director Alexandra McGuinness and featuring breakout star, Antonia Campbell-Hughes (who also appears in The Other Side of Sleep).

This year's festival will feature nearly fifty shorts including a programme dedicated to dance on film. Selected titles in the shorts category for CIFF 2011 include SHOE (directed by Nick Kelly; shortlisted for an Academy Award 2011), PAPERMAN (winner of Best Animation at the Canadian International Film Festival), THE CHRISTENING (directed by Oonagh Kearney; official selection Galway Film Fleadh 2011), THE HEIST (directed by Thomas Hefferon; official selection Palm Springs International Film Festival 2011) and SMALL CHANGE (official selection Sundance Film Festival 2011). The Capital Irish Film Festival is produced by Solas Nua (which means new light in Irish), a 501(c)3 non-profit and the only contemporary Irish arts organization in the United States. Based in Washington, DC, our mission is to bring the best new artistic talent from Ireland to audiences in America. We achieve this through unique programming which includes a theatre, visual arts, Irish Book Day, Paisean Faisean, the Solas Salon and dance.
